

# Manifesto: My key aims as women's officer

## Intersectionality

- work closely with other liberations officers to ensure that the needs of all women and transfeminine / non-binary members of college are met
- set up an online suggestions form on gender-related issues to address/ways to improve college life [anonymity optional]
- enlist the help of women from the BME, LGBTQ+ and disabled community as much as possible

## Events

- publicise uni-wide events such as talks on feminism and social events for women
  - create Facebook event pages so people from St Hilda's can attend as a group
- organise a varied, intersectional and eventful gender equality week
- hold regular self-care events such as movie nights, arts&crafts afternoons and informal drop-in sessions

## Health & welfare

- create + distribute informative resources on sexual health, consent, and who to contact in the event of a crisis
- provide information on how to arrange check-ups and get contraceptives under the NHS [especially for freshers and international students!]
- organise a mandatory + definitive workshop on sexual consent in freshers week
  - ensure discussions/definitions of rape are not gendered or heteronormative
  - establish a safe space for discussions where anyone is allowed to leave if they find content triggering
- work with welfare officers to maintain a stock of free sanitary products in college
